Our 4th/5th and 6th class pupils participated in the 'Elephant in the Room' project. This project is part of the Galway 20/20 'Small Towns, Big Ideas Project' run by Ballygar Arts and Theatre group. Our pupils took part in a lantern making workshop in the town hall with artists Tom Meskell and Sheila Flanagan. The project centres around the theme of combating racism and the lanterns symbolize shining a light on racism. The children's lanterns will be displayed at the 'Elephant in the Room Festival' in Ballygar between September 14th-22nd 2019.

Local History Workshops

Martin Curley, Heritage Ireland completed 5 Local history workshops with 5th/6th class in January and February. These workshops involved the children researching the history of their townland. Using historical archives published online, the children researched people who lived in their townland during the plantations, the changes of landownership during the plantations, people living in their townland in the 1900s, historical sites in their townland and the geology of their townlands. The children really enjoyed these workshops and learnt a lot about the history of their local area and each completed a project based on the information they learnt.

Connaught Cup
